This unprecedented action will set in motion a chain of events familiar to all of us in Pratt's plants.

As soon as a Buyer is identified, the company will give the Union formal notice of such action, and then the IAM will make a formal request for "Meet and Confer". This process is identified in Article 27 of the CBA. A few questions were asked after this announcement, and the answers are quite disturbing to say the least. Is the Middletown Power House also up for sale? Answer - NO.

Isn't our Power House big enough that we could sell power to the Utilities?

Answer - We are in the business of selling engines not power.

How are we going to get the power that we need to run the business here?

Answer - We will make an agreement so we can buy power generated from the new Owners.

Brothers and sisters, actions like this could have a big impact on our future as well as our continued employment here in East Hartford.

Let's start by considering that "energy" is one of the most expensive items that a corporation needs to operate a business. With that in Mind, we know that more than 90% of the energy generated, by the East Hartford Power Plant is consumed by the plant itself.



That's almost like having an oil well in your backyard along with a power plant and a generator to provide all of the electricity, hot water, heat etc. for your use.

Kind of like having one less BIG Ticket Item expense out of your budget, Right? Whoever came up with this "Brain Tumor" of an idea is extremely bright or stupid.

OR is it a well calculated, long term plan to achieve the final goal of moving all of the work out of East Hartford? You do remember the UTC spokesman that uttered those now famous words:

"Anywhere but Connecticut".

Could it be that the new "person in Charge of F&S" needs to make some immediate big financial gain and cost cutting for the Corporation that could assure the rapid rise up the corporate ladder?

What ever it turns out to be, it spells nothing good for us.

We will go from almost energy independence to Energy Dependence on the new owner's profits dreams.

When the price of energy rises, so will the cost and eventually guess what?

the ancient fable about "Killing the golden goose" is a story that fits perfectly.




shifts. This language is available in our union collective bargaining agreement. (Contract)
